#### Check In Hours

## -No early arrivals

Friday October 2nd . 4:30PM to 7PM Saturday October 3 8AM to 9AM Sunday October 4 . 8AM to 9AM

- Please report directly to check-in <u>before</u> unloading. Everyone entering the showgrounds must have their temperature taken, fill out a COVID-19 Questionnaire and hand in the signed COVID-19 waiver. Those with temperatures above 100°F are <u>not</u> permitted to enter the show grounds. Once you have been approved for entry you will be given a bracelet that must be worn at all times while on the show grounds. Fabric face masks must be worn at all times while under a roof (inside) and when within 6ft of anyone else. Check in procedures and COVID-19 procedures may change due to COVID-19 procedures. Please check both Facebook and your email for updates.
- Unfortunately we can not allow any arrivals before 4:30pm on Friday, October 2nd.
- Checkout by 7pm Sunday night.
- Please contact us <u>at least one week in advance</u> if you need to arrive <u>after</u> office hours or leave late on Sunday, we will do our best to accommodate you. \$20 fee will apply.

Late Entry Fee

All entries not received as pre-entries (postmarked by Sept 8th) will incur a \$20 late fee per horse

Payment

Refunds

Refunds (minus office fee, stall fee, and shavings) will be made only if an authentic veterinary certificate is received by the show secretary no later than 8am October 3rd, 2020.

\*When a check is returned for insufficient funds, or an exhibitor has unpaid show balances or expenses, the exhibitor must reimburse the club for all funds and/or expenses incurred within 5 days of the initial occurrence and pay a \$25 service fee. If payment is not made within 5 days the exhibitor will be expelled or suspended by NEGHC. GVHS and GHRA will be notified. All awards and placings will be eliminated.

## **Entry Requirements**

- Current copy of registration papers must be submitted with entries for all Gypsy, Drum and Gypsy Cross horses.
- Pre-entries only. All entries must be postmarked by September 20th.
- Liability waivers must be completed with all requested names and signatures and must be submitted with entries.
- **Health Requirements** Current, Negative Equine Infectious Anemia (EIA/Coggins) Test; and a rabies vaccine within the last 12 months are required for all horses. Out-of-state horse must have a coggins within 12 months and a valid health certificate (valid for 30 days following date of examination).

# Stabling

- Permanent wood stalls on dirt floor with full doors, and a limited number of portable show stalls are available. Please note on your entry form if you prefer a specific stall type. Stalls will be given in order of entries received.
- Stall fee DOES NOT include shavings. Shavings can be obtained for a fee with pre-entries or you may bring your own.
- Horses and Exhibitors are only permitted on the grounds after 4:30pm on Thursday for GVHS Evaluations or 4:30 Friday for the show.

#### **COVID-19 Procedures and Guidelines**

- Failure to comply with all guidelines and procedures will result in dismissal from the event without a refund.
- Please report directly to check-in before unloading. Everyone entering the showgrounds must have their temperature taken, fill out a COVID-19 Questionnaire and hand in the signed COVID-19 waiver. Those with temperatures above 100°F are not permitted to enter the show grounds. Once you have been approved for entry you will be given a bracelet that must be worn at all times while on the show grounds. Fabric face masks must be worn at all times except when riding or driving a horse.
- Please see the detailed NEGHC 2020 Show Guidelines and Procedures Document.
- Procedures may adjust due to COVID-19 procedures. Please check our Facebook and your email for updates.
- We appreciate your help in making this show a safe environment by abiding by all Guidelines and Policies. Following these Policies and Guidelines is necessary for this show to be held during this time.
- Pre-entries only. All entries must be postmarked by September 20th.

#### **Accommodations**

- All campers must display their paid camper card in the left hand corner of the vehicle.
- Hotels in the area are available. We suggest the Hampton Inn in Clifton Park.

#### **Definitions**

- 1. **Age of Equine** for competition purposes is considered to be one year old on the 1st day of January following the actual date of foaling.
- 2. Youth is an individual who has not reached his/her 18th birthday as of January 1st of the current competition year. A Youth exhibitor may NOT show a stallion in hand, or under saddle, including lead line. A Youth age 12 or older may show a weanling colt in hand. No one under the age of 12 may show any horse under the age of three, including leading in a lead-line class. Any Youth exhibitor anywhere on the show grounds while riding a horse is required to wear an equestrian safety helmet that is ATSM/SEI approved. Youth must also wear an ATSM/SEI helmet while driving or serving as driving groom.
- 3. Amateur is an individual that has reached his/her 18th birthday as of January 1st of the current competition year. An Amateur exhibitor does not receive monies/reimbursement for any type of horse training in any breed or discipline. Please see GVHS rules for more details on amateur status. Every exhibitor in this division must hold amateur status or be under the age of 18. Amateur cards must be presented at check in. A person is considered an amateur if, regardless of their equestrian skills and/or accomplishments they have not engaged in any activities listed on the GVHS website which would make him/her a professional.
- 4. **Open** Equitation Classes are open to all exhibitors (including youth and amateur).
- 5. **Gypsy** Horses must be purebred and defined in Division Rules.

#### General Rules

- 1. For Gypsy, Gypsy Cross & Drum Classes: GVHS Rules will be used as a guideline. The decisions of the judges/management will be final. Competitors are required to read the GVHS Show Rules prior to the show. The rule book is located at http://vanners.org/pdf\_post/gvhs-show-rules/.
- 2. All classes not specified as "Gypsy", "Gypsy Cross", "Drum" or "Gypsy Cross & Drum" are open to **ALL BREEDS**: GVHS and USEF rules will be used as a guideline. The decisions of the judges/management will be final.
- 3. Exhibitors must be ready at the gate and enter the arena promptly. The gate will be closed two minutes after the first call for a missing exhibitor (unless otherwise notified). Exhibitors will not be allowed to enter after the gate is closed.
- 4. Not all of the Gypsy classes count for each registry. Please check which classes count for your chosen registry.
- 5. All add slips are due in the Show Office at least 3 classes before the class you are adding.
- 6. You must notify the office if a tack change is needed at least 3 classes prior to your class.
- 7. No one shall approach the judge with regard to a decision unless he first obtains permission from the ring steward who shall arrange an appointment with the judge at a proper time and place. The ring steward or a member of show management appointed by the ring steward shall be present for all appointments made. No exhibitor has the right to inspect the judge's cards without the judge's permission.
- 8. Everyone under 18 years of age must wear an approved helmet while mounted or driving at all times per NYS Law. All riders in Sit-A-Buck must wear an approved helmet.
- 9. The show committee, management or judge may and shall immediately order out of the ring or off the grounds: any person not showing sportsmanship, any person using profane language, any person displaying unsafe behavior and/or any unruly horse, habitual kicker, striker, biter or a horse not under control.
- 10. Cruelty to, or abuse of a horse by any person is forbidden. The judge and/or show management has the authority to dismiss from the class or showgrounds, any person for cruelty to, or abuse of a horse. If a rider is disqualified from showing by the management, or by officials, or if a horse is entered and not shown, the entry fee will not be refunded.
- 11. Lunging and schooling must be kept to designated areas only. No schooling when trail equipment is in the ring please.
- 12. Horses staying overnight must be stalled.
- 13. Exhibitors will be solely responsible for any consequential or other loss, injury or damage done to or occasioned by, or arising from any horse or article owned or exhibited by him/her and shall indemnify the show management and/or NEGHC and/or any agent thereof, against all legal or other proceedings, claims or demands of any kind

or nature in regard thereto, or that may arise from the negligence of the person in charge of any such horse or article.

- 14. No Stallions will be allowed in Leadline, Youth or Beginner classes.
- 15. All stallions should wear a *yellow* ribbon in their tails.
- 16. All horses that have a tendency to kick should wear a *red* ribbon in their tails.
- 17. All horses shall be show sound. Any horse showing evidence of lameness or broken wind shall be refused an award. The judge has the authority to dismiss any horse that is unsound. Obvious lameness will be cause for disqualification. Evidence of bleeding, either from the mouth or other areas of the horse shall be cause for elimination of that horse from that class.
- 18. Any saddle class having more than 20 horses in it must be split and worked in 2 sections and the top horses in each section are to be reworked for pinning. Driving classes should be split at the discretion of the show committee. Beginner and Green classes will be split if more than 14 horses.
- 19. A horse must be at least 3 years old to show under saddle.
- 20. A horse must be at least 2 years old to show in a driving class.
- 21. Being a member of the show committee does not exclude an individual from showing at said show.
- 22. Management reserves the right to cancel any classes due to hazardous weather, Acts of God, accidents, state guidelines, COVID-19, or emergencies. Every effort will be made to reschedule with priority given to any qualifying classes being offered. No refunds for cancellations due to hazardous weather, Acts of God, accidents, state guidelines, COVID-19 or emergencies. Management reserves the right to change officials, limit entries, combine or cancel classes, and modify the schedule as required by circumstances to the competition specifications listed herein.
- 23. Classes may be added, combined, split, or deleted at the discretion of Show Management.
- 24. All dogs must be leashed and restrained. If a dog is found to be unleashed, the owner and the dog may be asked to leave the show grounds. For safety purposes it is strongly suggested that no dogs be near or around the show ring, entrance and exit gate. If a dog is found to be disturbing or dangerous the owner will be asked to remove the dog from the show grounds immediately. No fees will be refunded. You MUST clean up after your dog.
- 25. A horse must be shown under the same number throughout the entire competition.

#### **Division Rules**

• In the interest of fair & balanced competition, the same horse/rider combinations can not compete in both three speed (walk trot/jog canter/lope) classes and two speed (walk trot/jog) classes. The same Horse/Rider combinations cannot show in both equitation walk/trot and equitation walk/trot/canter.

#### Gypsy Division

Horses in Gypsy specific classes must be full blood Gypsy and registered with at least one of the following registries: Gypsy Vanner Horse Society (GVHS), the Gypsy Horse Registry of America, (GHRA), the Gypsy Cob and Drum Horse Association (GCDHA), Traditional Gypsy Cob Association (TGCA), Irish Cob Society (ICS), or the Gypsy Horse Association (GHA). Proof of registration must be presented with entry forms. Horses may cross enter into open classes. <u>All GVHS registered horses need GVHS registration numbers on entry form.</u>

## • Gypsy Cross & Drum

Horses must be registered either as a Gypsy Cross, Gypsian or Drum in GHA, GCDHA, IDHA, TGCA, ICS or GHRA or in a Gypsian registry. Proof of registration must be presented with entry forms. Horses may cross enter into open classes.

# Youth Division

For individuals who have not reached his/her 18th birthday as of January 1st of the current competition year. A Youth exhibitor may NOT show a stallion in hand, or under saddle, including lead line. A Youth age 12 or older may show a weanling colt in Halter. Any Youth exhibitor anywhere on the show grounds while riding or driving a

horse is required to wear an equestrian safety helmet that is ATSM/SEI approved. <u>Youth ALL BREED classes are only \$5 each! Youth GYPSY classes are only \$10 each!</u>

#### Leadline Division

For riders nine years old and under. Riders with Special Needs of ANY age are welcome in our lead line division. Exhibitors can not enter any other divisions. No stallions. The horse must be led by an adult 18 years of age or older.

# • All Breed Green Horse Division WT/J

Classes are only for horses in their first or second year of showing and have never cantered at a show. Horses may be ridden English or Western. These classes are *walk*, *trot/jog*. There are no age restrictions on horses eligible for this division. No beginner riders may show in the Green Horse division.

## Gypsy Green Horse WT/J

Classes are only for Gypsy Horses that are in their first two years of showing and have never cantered at a show. Competition year is defined as January 1st through December 31st. Horses may be ridden English or Western. These classes are *walk*, *trot/jog*. There are no age restrictions on horses eligible for this division. No beginner riders may show in the Green Horse division.

# • Gypsy Green Horse WJL/WTC

Classes are only for Gypsy Horses that are in their first year cantering at a show. Competition year is defined as January 1st through December 31st. Horses may be ridden English or Western. These classes are *walk*, *trot/jog*, *canter/lope*. There are no age restrictions on horses eligible for this division. No beginner riders may show in the Green Horse division.

### • Beginner Rider Divisions

Rider in his/her first or second year of showing regardless of age— Once a rider has cantered or loped at any show a return to a walk/trot/jog class is prohibited. No stallions allowed. Beginner exhibitors are not eligible for any other classes except Showmanship, Halter, and Driving. Exhibitors are eligible for two years in this Walk-Trot/Jog division. These classes are walk/trot/jog only. We will also accept riders who would typically be in "Academy" classes and will allow those rules including dress code (black pants and white button down or polo).

#### Amatuer

Please see Amateur definition. If a competitor places in both an amateur and open class of the same type (for example, Gypsy English Equitation Open and Gypsy English Equitation Amateur) the class with the higher placing will count for show end points. You may *not* earn show end points from both classes. Prize money won in any amateur or owner class does not affect the amateur status of a person otherwise qualified. Amateur status does not allow amateurs to accept prize money in equitation or showmanship classes that are not amateur or owner classes.

# Class Rules

- Patterns will be posted at least one hour prior to the class.
- Note that any riding class not listed as Beginner, WT/J, WT, WJ or 2 Speed (walk trot/jog) or Green Horse WT/J is a three-gate class, except leadline.

• In the interest of fair & balanced competition, the same horse/rider combinations can not compete in both three speed (walk trot/jog canter/lope) classes and two speed (walk trot/jog) classes. For example, the same Horse/Rider combinations cannot show in both equitation walk/trot and equitation walk/trot/canter. The Versatility Challenge is the exception to this rule for youth and amateurs only.

# • Gypsy Champion Halter Classes

First and second place winners, in each age group halter class will show for Champion and Reserve Champion. The Champion horse from each gender group will then compete for Supreme Champion. There will be an individual Supreme Champion. Majority System will be used in judging.

#### • <u>Liberty</u>

Exhibitors may show individually or with a helper. Horses must be a minimum of 2 years old. Any gender of horse is allowed. The presentation must be one and a half minutes (1 1/2). An email with a link to the music must be sent to neghcshow@gmail.com with directions for use. Show Management is not responsible for links that do not play correctly or skip, malfunction. It is the Owner's responsibility to test music prior to the presentation with the Announcer/Music Steward. The exhibitor (and helper, if applicable) enter the arena with the horse. At the first sound of music, the halter is removed and the horse runs "free" in the arena demonstrating various gaits. The music should be timed to exactly one and half minutes (1 ½). Once the music stops, the exhibitor has exactly two (2) minutes to catch and replace the Bridle or Halter on the horse's head. A helper may assist in the arena but may not catch or touch the horse. Neither the exhibitor nor the helper may touch the horse in any way during the performance. One Whip per exhibitor and helper are allowed. No other props or aids may be used. Bullwhips not allowed. Baiting to catch the horse is not permitted. Liberty is "free will", the horse is to express/exhibit natural behaviors and gaits that are a true representation of the breed in it's natural state with no outside forces. There should be an effortless communication between human and horse in the ring that demonstrates a cohesive partnership with the horse being a willing follower, the horse is to be judged on movement, showing various gaits in each direction, style, type and quality. Use of entire arena in both directions. Consideration is to be given to how the horse performed during his exhibition. The horse should give the impression that he/she is enjoying their Liberty class time, not that he/she is being forced to perform.

• Gypsy Solid Color & Blagdon Halter Any age, any sex of solid color (e.g. bay, palomino, buckskin, gray, chestnut, etc.) or Blagdon pattern (sabino also known as flecked roan or roan. Blue eyes are common, head and legs usually exhibit extensive white flecked or roan edges. Body white may spread up from belly or flank with flecked or roan edges. May be minimally marked to almost white with colored ears). Judged 80% on quality and richness of color and 20% on conformation.

#### Gypsy Broken Color Halter

Any age, any sex of non-solid color (e.g. bay, palomino, buckskin, gray, chestnut, etc.). Judged 80% on quality and richness of color and 20% on conformation.

#### Driving

American Driving Society Performance rules are used as a guideline. Driving classes will be held outside on the grass unless weather or general conditions are not suitable.

# • Gypsy Obstacle Driving

To be judged on the basis of performance and manners (in motion and at rest). A single horse hitched to a suitable two wheeled cart is the appropriate entry for this class. The harness and vehicle must be safe and in serviceable condition. The judge will dismiss any unsafe entry whether due to equipment or behavior of the animal. Each entry will work individually through an obstacle course designed to test the performance and manners of a good working animal. Judged based on performance at each obstacle and overall manners and gaits. The course shall consist of at least four obstacles such as (A) Back through an obstacle, (B) Walk through

a water obstacle or simulated water, (C) Pick up and move coat or slicker or put on and take off, (D) Drive between poles, bales of hay or other obstacles making a narrow passage, (E) Mail Box- Stop, open mail box, remove mail, return mail to box, and close box, (F) Weaving and figure 8, (G) Back up four steps. The pattern will be posted at least one hour before the class is held. If sufficient entries are present, this class may be divided into youth, amateur and open. The judges may impose a time limit or number of refusals before the driver must pass to the next obstacle. It is emphasized that this is an obstacle driving class and that a good entry is one that will provide a pleasant, responsive drive for the driver. The driver should be neatly dressed. Off course will result in elimination from the class.

# • Gypsy Obstacle Ground Driving

This class will be a ground driving in harness class, with the same pattern and general rules as the Gypsy Obstacle Driving class.

#### **Awards**

Ribbons and awards will need to be picked up at the no-contact ribbons booth when announced. If exhibitors are unable to pick up their ribbons or awards at the designated time they must contact <a href="mailto:neghcshow@gmail.com">neghcshow@gmail.com</a> to make arrangements for pick up or to pay for shipping of the awards.

**TWO JUDGES AND TWO SETS OF RIBBONS.** Rosettes up to 6th place in all classes except for championship classes

#### SHOW END POINT TABULATIONS:

Points for awards are based on the number of exhibitors in the class, and are as follows:

1st place -6 points, 2nd place -5 points, 3rd place -4 points, 4th place -3 points, 5th place -2 points, 6 place -1 point.  $\frac{1}{2}$  point is given to an entry who is the only entry in the class.

#### HALTER AWARDS

There will be one Grand Champion and Reserve Champion Horse from each Gypsy sex division per judge. There will be only one Supreme champion chosen by agreement between the two judges from the Grand Champion in-hand, Halter class.



# NEGHC COVID-19 2020 Show Guidelines and Procedures

# **Entrance to showgrounds:**

- Enter and exit through the Main Entrance on Stillwater Bridge Road.
- No one besides Management and NEGHC BoD is allowed to arrive on the property before 4:30 pm Friday October
   2nd
- Everyone entering showgrounds is required to check their own temperature and assess their own wellness prior to arrival.
- Everyone entering the showgrounds will stop at the entrance desk and hand in signed COVID-19 Health Screening Assessment as well as have their temperature taken.
- Those with temperatures above 99.5°F (37.5°C), and those who traveled in the same vehicle are NOT permitted to enter the showgrounds.
- Only people essential to the showing of the horses will be allowed on the show grounds.
- Everyone who has been cleared to enter will receive a bracelet that must be worn at all times on the showgrounds.
- Individuals at the check-in, secretary and awards tables must maintain six feet from others and must wear a mask or face covering, covering their mouth and nose.
- Those older than 65 years old and/or have an underlying medical condition that increases your COVID-19 risk, please consider consulting your physician prior to attending the horse show.
- If you have been exhibiting COVID-19 Symptoms (cough, shortness of breath or difficulty breathing, fever, chills, muscle pain, sore throat and/or new loss of taste of smell) or you have been in contact with someone who has tested positive for COVID-19 in the last 14 days, please stay home and get well.
- Upon entering the fairgrounds, please leave 12 ft between all vehicles.
- Camper spots must be pre-reserved, and will be assigned and limited to every third spot.

#### **Spectators:**

• Outside spectators will not be allowed on the grounds. Essential personnel includes the exhibitor, a trainer OR groom and one family member IF the exhibitor is a minor.

#### **Social Distancing & Respiratory Etiquette**

- Ensure a distance of at least six feet is maintained among individuals at all times, whether indoor or outdoor. If a shorter distance is required for tacking horses etcetera, individuals must wear acceptable face coverings.
- Acceptable face coverings for COVID-19 include but are not limited to cloth-based face coverings and disposable
  masks all face coverings must cover both the mouth and nose.
- When mounted or driving a horse, riders/drivers have the option to wear a mask or face covering but it is not required.
- Follow appropriate respiratory hygiene and cough etiquette- sneeze into your elbow.
- Hand washing and/or sanitizing stations will be provided.
- No congregating with those outside of your cohort on the showgrounds.
- In the event of a thunderstorm or rain, please seek shelter in your vehicle. DO NOT shelter in common areas or the stabling area.
- Limit capacity to no more than 50% of the maximum occupancy for a particular area.
- Please do not lean/sit on fences or gates.

# Hygiene, Cleaning, and Disinfection

- Please do not share equipment with others outside of your cohort unless the equipment is able to be cleaned and disinfected between use.
- Hand hygiene stations will be provided, including handwashing with soap, water, and paper towels, as well as an alcohol based hand sanitizer containing 60% or more alcohol for areas where handwashing is not feasible.
- Hand sanitizer will be placed throughout the site.
- Restrooms will be limited to half capacity. There will be a bathroom attendant to sanitize the area.

# Secretary's Office & Administration

- The Secretary's office will be located in the Indoor Ring View Room. Only one exhibitor in the office at a time.
- We are accepting pre-entries only.
- PayPal will be accepted for payment of entries.
- All required forms must be completed before back number are assigned.

## **Competition, Schooling and Exercise Areas**

- Competition schedule changes and updates will be announced.
- At the in-gate and exit-gate area, only the trainer is allowed except for youth who can have a family member.
- Please watch from the sides of the ring, while keeping social distance of at least 6 feet from those outside your own cohort.
- All show rings will have a separate In-gate and Out-gate or one way traffic flow and/or there will be time between entering and exiting groups.
- Patterns will be posted via Facebook and on the wall outside of the Secretary's office at least the night before show day.

## **Schooling Rings**

• A minimum of 2 horse lengths must be kept between horses.

#### **Stabling**

Stabling was configured to allow for social distancing. Please do not use the empty stalls.

#### **Ribbons & Awards**

- Ribbons and awards will not be handed out in or at the ring.
- There will not be any trophy presentations.
- Ribbons can be picked up at the Awards Table. Please follow social distancing. 1 Person at the table at a time.

We understand that wearing masks and following these guidelines at a horse show can be inconvenient but please remember that following these procedures is necessary to hold a show at this time.
